The IEEE Canada (Region 7) invites nominations for the volunteer position of Editor-in-Chief for the IEEE Canadian Journal of Electrical and Computer Engineering (ICJECE) starting in December 2024, until December 31, 2025, renewable annually.

## IEEE Canadian Journal of Electrical and Computer Engineering (ICJECE)

The ICJECE is the quarterly journal of IEEE Canada, publishing high-quality refereed technical papers in broad areas of electrical and computer engineering (for more information, please see <a href="http://journal.ieee.ca">http://journal.ieee.ca</a>). The ICJECE disseminates scientific and engineering information on research and development in Canada and abroad since 1976.

## Credibility

The papers published in the Journal are peer reviewed per the requirements in the IEEE PSPB Operations Manual (sections 8.2.1.C & 8.2.2.A). Articles are screened for uniqueness and plagiarism before the review process. The single-anonymous peer review process for each article involves minimum of two independent reviewers, where the identities of the reviewers are not known to the authors, but the reviewers know the identities of the authors.

**Note**: Authors from low-income countries are eligible for waived or reduced Open Access Article Processing Charges.

### **ICJECE Principal Goals**

- To attract high quality research papers from Canada and abroad in emerging and established areas of research relevant to the ICJECE fields of interest.
- To reach out and increase its relevance to Canada's and international scientific and engineering communities spanning industry, academia and government organizations.
- To increase the ICJECE impact factor and other impact metrics.
- To inform IEEE members and non-members on issues related to the advancements of technology and its contributions to economic and societal benefits worldwide.
- To publish on schedule.

### Qualifications

- An IEEE member in good standing of IEEE Fellow or Senior Member grade.
- Extensive editorial experience as EiC, Co-EiC, Senior Editor/Technical Area Editor, Associate Editor or Guest Editor for reputable journal(s).
- Prior experience with CJECE as an author, reviewer, and/or editor would be an asset.
- Capacity to manage a journal that receives around 400 submissions per year.
- Demonstrated competence in at least one of the topical areas of CJECE.
- Demonstrated high technical accomplishments and professional reputation, with a strong publication record in IEEE and other reputable publications.
- Professional integrity and high ethical standards.
- Excellent communication skills.

- Demonstrable organizational and management skills, with leadership experience and ability to work cooperatively in a team.
- Vision for further increasing visibility of the Journal and its standing in the Canadian and international scientific and engineering community.

## Responsibilities

- Chairing the ICJECE Editorial Committee (Board). The Board consists of the Editor-in-Chief, possibly Co-Editor(s)-in-Chief, Technical Area Editors, Associate Editors and occasionally Guest Editor(s).
- Finding the (optional) Co-EiCs, Technical Area Editors, Associate Editors and Guest Editor(s) and collaborating with them to achieve the ICJECE objectives and smooth operation.
- Managing the day-to-day ICJECE operations.
- Identifying and proposing solutions to the IEEE Canada Publications and Communications Committee (PCC) Chair and executing approved solutions.
- Reporting to the IEEE Canada PCC Chair on a regular basis on matters concerning the Journal.
- Serving on the IEEE Canada PCC as a voting member.
- Participating in making decisions about publication policies and priorities.
- Working with the ICJECE Editorial Board to create strategic and long-term plans for the Journal.
- Adhering to the IEEE policies and guidelines regarding EiC responsibilities and duties, which can be found in the Section 2.4 of IEEE Publication Services and Products Board Operations Manual (2024) (<a href="http://www.ieee.org/documents/opsmanual.pdf">http://www.ieee.org/documents/opsmanual.pdf</a>).

#### Nominations must include:

- Name of the nominee and the nominee's IEEE membership number, and, if applicable, the nominator (self-nominations are accepted).
- A statement of interest of up to 500 words including the nominee's vision for the ICJECE.
- A brief biography of up to 200 words, including a list of the nominee's editorial credentials/previous editorial experience and most important publications.
- The nominee's curriculum vitae of up to 9,000 words max.
